



Art in the Library

What is *Art in the Library*?

Art in the Library is a program sponsored by the North Olympic Library System, which provides display space for works created by Clallam County artists. **Art in the Library** exhibits rotate on a regular two or three month schedule.

There is no fee or commission fee to display art as a part of the **Art in the Library** program. The Library is not involved in the sale of artwork on display at the library. Prices may be posted and/or a price list provided. The Library will provide artist contact information to interested buyers.

Currently **Art in the Library** exhibit space is available in the **Port Angeles Main Library** and the **Sequim Branch Library**.

Display space is available for two dimensional wall hung art. Limited display space for three dimensional pieces is also available: appropriateness of three dimensional works to available display spaces will be considered on a case-by-case basis. All display space is located within the library itself (not in public meeting rooms). No insurance or other extraordinary measures will be taken by the Library to protect art displayed in the library.

How do I apply to show my work in an *Art in the Library* exhibit?

Selection and scheduling of artists, and layout of exhibits, is overseen by a volunteer **Art in the Library** Exhibit Coordinator at each library.

Generally speaking, display space and exhibit dates will be assigned to artists on a first-come-first-served basis. However, in accepting artist applications and assigning dates for **Art in the Library** exhibits, the following criteria may also be taken into account:

- Space availability relative to other works already accepted for a given exhibit period
- Appropriateness of available display spaces to the type/display needs of the works
- Aesthetic design of the exhibit relative to other works already accepted

- Nature /content of the artist's work relative to seasonal or topical themes
- Provision of equitable display opportunities for all interested Clallam County artists

Display guidelines for *Art in the Library* exhibits.

Art in the Library works must be presentation ready and appropriate for display in a public setting. The Library reserves the right to reject any items not deemed suitable for display.

The Library provides an art rail system with cables and adjustable hooks from which wall hung artwork will be displayed.

Display of three dimensional art will be considered on a case-by-case basis subject to size, fragility, value, and display needs of the pieces.

Two dimensional wall art must be properly framed with a wire on the back for hanging. Works done on paper must be under glass or Plexiglas. Glass must be clean.

Artists must provide a biographical statement, price list, and display label for the exhibit.

Upon acceptance to an exhibit, **Art in the Library** Exhibit Coordinators will provide artists with exact display requirements (optimum hanging height, distance between works, layout/location, etc.), specific to the displaying library and the assigned exhibit.

Artists are responsible for installation and removal of their own displayed materials. This may require use of a ladder (provided by library). Exact installation dates and times for each show will be determined and scheduled by the exhibit coordinators. Removals and installations will generally be scheduled to coincide with the First Friday (in Sequim) and Second Weekend (in Port Angeles) community art events.
