Put on your PJs, steep some tea, and snuggle in for an evening of poetry hosted by Dokken and S. Drew Bloyer. The hosts will share poems by Palestinian poets, their own work, and then open the mic for attendees' poems. Have a pen and paper ready to participate in short writing prompts.

# **Poetry Walks**

Explore poetry in the landscape along three Olympic National Park trails – Hall of Mosses, Madison Falls, and Spruce Railroad – through May 31. Two of Dokken's poems are newly on display this year.

Stop by Hurricane Coffee, 104 W. Washington St., Sequim, to read poetry written by community members on an interactive display created by Dokken. You can take a poem and use the writing supplies provided to leave a poem of your own in its place.

Events with the Poet Laureate should be free and open to the public, with the exception of school or corrections facility visits.

Appointed in April 2023, Dokken became Clallam County's first poet laureate. The North Olympic Library System (NOLS), in partnership with Clallam County, created the position as a way to promote poetry in the community. In their first year as poet laureate, Dokken has hosted nearly 30 events and programs across the county.
